"Hey, I just saw a job advertisement on the internet for our boss's position. But, he hasn't said anything about retiring or quitting.

You can say,

"Oh really? That's very intriguing. I wonder if he's going to get fired."

Now in this situation when you use the word intriguing you are saying,

- 1) What you just said to me is very interesting.
- 2) What you just said makes me even more curious and I want to know more.

And 3) Tell me anything else you know about this subject
